INVITATION FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

PARTNERSHIP TO SUPPORT THE STUDY ON THE DRIVERS OF HARMFUL SOCIAL NORMS ON GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (GBV)

The United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) is initiating the process of selecting partners to delve into the study of the drivers behind harmful social norms. Aligned with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and their ambitious timeline, there's a critical urgency to understand the societal dynamics influencing harmful behaviors. This study aims to contextualize this imperative within the Philippines by thoroughly investigating the underlying causes of harmful social norms. By analyzing factors such as cultural beliefs, institutional frameworks, and socio-economic conditions, this initiative seeks to provide insights that can guide interventions aimed at challenging and transforming these norms. Through this comprehensive examination, the goal is to inform strategies that promote more inclusive and equitable societies, ultimately contributing to the prevention and reduction of harmful social norms across the nation.

The study will be carried out this year (2024) which involves the following phases:

Phase 1. Preparation and Inception Report:

Preparation of an inception report outlining the proposed study design and detailed research
methodology including the selection of sample population and identification of sample size, work
plan and projected timelines of activities, targeting of specific areas and selection of respondents,
data collection tools such as survey forms/ questionnaire and interview/ consultation guide
questions designed to capture the data needed and frequency of reports.

Phase 2: Contextual Understanding

• Review of relevant national and local literature, policies, and guidelines to inform the study.

Phase 3: Research Design and Planning

- Refinement of the research design based on a thorough contextual understanding.
- Employment of a mixed-method approach to comprehensively collect data, combining quantitative surveys and qualitative interviews to capture nuanced insights.
- Development an ethically sound and culturally sensitive data collection plan to uphold the integrity of the study and respect the diverse backgrounds of participants.

Phase 4: Stakeholder Engagement and Consultations

• Coordination among relevant national and local stakeholders and facilitation of national and regional consultations to gather insights and foster collaboration.

Phase 5: Data Collection

- Quantitative and qualitative data collection to understand social norms and its impact on GBV.
- Identification and understanding of the following key elements through data collection:
 - a. Drivers of harmful social norms related to GBV.
 - b. Key influencers of harmful social norms.
 - c. Champions advocating for GBV prevention especially within study's focus regions.
 - d. Areas where harmful social norms manifest.

Phase 6: Analysis of Data Collected

• Analyzation of data collected, using both quantitative and qualitative methods to extract meaningful insights. Identification of patterns, trends, and correlations to deepen understanding of the underlying factors driving GBV and inform evidence-based interventions.

Phase 7: Reporting and Documentation

- Development of a comprehensive study report documenting findings, recommendations, and insights from the assessment.
- Development of a streamlined and user-friendly version of the study for use as informational and communicative resource materials.

Phase 8: Implementation Support and Workshop Facilitation

- Provision of technical support and guidance to UNFPA and its partners in implementing recommendations from the study.
- Facilitation of a national-level workshop for UNFPA and key stakeholders to discuss assessment findings and recommend strategies for addressing identified gaps and challenges in the GBV Service Delivery Network.

Through mapping the current landscape of social norms on GBV, evaluating their prevalence and impact, identifying the drivers, and analyzing existing interventions, the aim of the study is to generate actionable insights for stakeholders. This includes recommendations for policy reforms, community-based initiatives, and educational campaigns aimed at challenging and transforming harmful social norms.

The selected implementing partner will support the comprehensive study of the underlying factors driving harmful social norms in the Philippines. The IP's involvement will be pivotal in ensuring the study's success through providing various essential capacities necessary for effective execution and the attainment of high-quality results. The IP has to ensure that the study is conducted in an ethical and culturally sensitive manner, respecting the rights and dignity of all participants involved in the study process.

to provide support for the study on the Drivers of Social Norms on Gender-Based Violence

Hiring Office:	United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), Philippines
Background and Rationale:	The UNFPA 9th Country Programme for the Philippines is committed to empowering women and girls, particularly those marginalized and left behind, along with decision-makers in selected provinces. The goal is to enhance their agency and capacity to address discriminatory gender and social norms. This includes promoting gender equality, enhancing women's decision-making abilities, and ensuring access to sexual and reproductive health and rights.
	As the leading advocate and coordinator for Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and Gender-Based Violence (GBV), UNFPA Philippines has spearheaded numerous consultations. These dialogues involved a wide range of stakeholders, such as government bodies, non-governmental organizations, civil society groups, international development partners, and other United Nations (UN) agencies. The primary objective of these consultations was to facilitate the development of a comprehensive National Strategy for Gender-Based Violence (GBV).
	The consultations sought to identify the challenges, gaps, priorities, and opportunities in addressing GBV. They aimed to foster a holistic approach, ensuring the involvement of all relevant stakeholders in championing efforts against Violence Against Women (VAW) in the Philippines. Through these collaborative efforts, UNFPA is working towards a more inclusive and effective strategy to combat GBV and promote gender equality in the country.
	During consultations with the Philippine Commission on Women (PCW), the serving Secretariat for the Inter-Agency Council on Violence Against Women and their Children (IACVAWC), it was highlighted that the Council, chaired by the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) and co-chaired by the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG), is in the early stages of developing a National Action Plan on Ending Violence Against Women (NAPEVAW). Recognizing the importance of this initiative, UNFPA has decided to align its efforts with NAPEVAW, demonstrating full support for the government's efforts to address gender-based violence (GBV) in the country.
	The previous National Strategic Plan on VAWC 2017-2022 outlined three key pillars: Primary Prevention, Response System, and Cross-Cutting Actions and Structures. Through consultations, it was revealed that Prevention has been the weakest pillar across all sectors. In response, UNFPA Philippines, in line with its 9th Country Programme, has taken proactive steps to address this gap. It has initiated a series of studies on GBV prevention to generate evidence that can inform NAPEVAW and enhance knowledge. These studies aim not only to inform NAP EVAW but also to enhance knowledge and provide a comprehensive baseline dataset for UNFPA CO Philippines. One of these studies focuses on the Drivers of Harmful Social Norms, seeking to identify key factors that sustain harmful gender and social norms. The insights from this study will be crucial in designing and implementing targeted prevention interventions that address the root causes of GBV in the Philippines with evidence-based strategies
Purpose:	 The specific objectives of the study are as follows: Identify key drivers influencing harmful social norms related to GBV in the Philippines. By identifying key actors and champions of GBV prevention, the study aims to unify actions, strengthen advocacies, and influence mobilization of support for GBV prevention efforts.

- 3. Understand and identify areas where harmful social norms manifest within the Philippine context, allowing interventions to be tailored accordingly.
- 4. Provide reliable insights and updated data to support advocacy efforts and drive action, boosting promotion and increasing awareness.
- 5. Generate evidence to inform policy and strategy development for addressing GBV in the Philippines.
- Provide technical assistance and disseminate findings to stakeholders involved in GBV prevention and response efforts, empowering them with the knowledge to effectively address GBV.

Study process and Scope of Work:

The IP will collaborate closely with the UNFPA International Consultant (IC), who will spearhead the study. The IP's role will be to assist the IC throughout the various phases of the study, which are scheduled to be conducted within this year and will start promptly upon agreement approval.

The IP's specific scope of work includes, but is not limited to the following:

- Support the mapping out of national, especially local policies, guidelines, regulations, research studies, journals, modules and other relevant literature sources to inform the desk review for the study.
- 2. Offer insights into the Philippines' context, existing protocols, and relevant procedures to assist in tailoring and developing an inception report and comprehensive research methodology.
- 3. Assist in identifying key national and local stakeholders relevant to advocating and implementing initiatives for GBV prevention and response, and support in facilitation and documentation of national and regional consultations/focus group discussions (FGDs) to gather insights and perspectives from these stakeholders, fostering collaboration and knowledge sharing among key actors.
- 4. Undertake quantitative and qualitative data collection within UNFPA priority areas by conducting surveys, in-depth interviews (IDIs), and FGDs.
- 5. Provide translation services for customizing data collection tools, conducting surveys, interviews, and focus group discussions. Translate collected data from local languages to English, ensuring accurate representation in both quantitative and qualitative methodologies.
- Provide support in producing a streamlined and user-friendly version of the study for use as informational and communicative resource materials.
- Manage logistical requirements including travel expenses of the participants for the national and regional consultations, and a national-level workshop, dedicated to disseminating the results of the study.
- Ensure that research, particularly data collection, is conducted ethically and with cultural sensitivity, respecting the rights and dignity of all participants involved in the study, particularly men and boys sharing sensitive information related to their experiences with GBV and gender norms.

Expected Outputs

The IP is expected to deliver the following main outputs for the study:

- Translated Data Collection Tools and Data Gathering (if needed):
 - Translation of data collection instruments such as surveys, interview questionnaires, and focus group discussion guides into local languages, as required.
 - Accurate translation of data collected in native languages to English, ensuring inclusivity across both quantitative and qualitative methodologies.
- Quantitative and Qualitative Collection and Insights Report
 - Consolidate both quantitative and qualitative data into a report.
 Organize and summarize the gathered information, providing

brief insights into the conduct of the study, and noting any additional observations made during data collection.

- Management and Reporting of National and Regional Stakeholder Consultations:
 - Management of all logistics required for the conduct of national and regional stakeholder consultations, which includes travel costs, venue, meals, accommodation, and other expenses, like supplies and materials, incidental allowance, miscellaneous, etc.
 - Support in facilitation of the consultations and document the proceedings during consultations, capturing key discussions and outcomes.
- Workshop Management and Reporting:
 - Management of all logistics required for the conduct of a national-level workshop, which includes travel costs, venue, meals, accommodation, and other expenses, like supplies and materials, incidental allowance, miscellaneous, etc.
 - Support in facilitation of the consultations and document the workshop activities, key discussions, and outcomes.

The IP will also be expected to support the IC on the following:

- Desk review: Assist the IC in identifying relevant national and local policies, guidelines, regulations, research studies, journals, modules, and other literature sources for the study's desk review.
- Streamlined Study Version: To support the development of a streamlined and user-friendly version of the study produced for use as informational and communicative resource materials, ensuring key messages are presented in an easily understandable manner.

Place where services are to be delivered:

The scope of the study will focus on the eight provinces identified as target areas by UNFPA CO Philippines. The IP will be visiting these provinces to conduct qualitative and quantitative data collection.

The IP will primarily operate remotely, delivering outputs to UNFPA Philippines online and meeting in person **at least** once per quarter for the Collegial Review and as needed. However, travel will be necessary for essential tasks such as data collection, consultations, fieldwork, workshops and reporting to the UNFPA office upon special request.

It's essential to identify and account for all the work and resources needed to achieve the expected outputs, including the management of all logistical needs associated with reporting, fieldwork, and data collection, which also involve the

national and regional stakeholder consultations. Regional consultations will be conducted in each target region as well as at the national level. Participants will vary based on the identified key stakeholders in each of these areas. Therefore, it is crucial to clearly outline all anticipated tasks that will require the IP's capabilities, network, human resources, travel arrangements, fieldwork, administrative functions, and other necessary elements. Similarly, when planning for the one-day national-level workshop, it is important to identify and consider all efforts and assets needed. Anticipating an attendance of 40-50 participants, including those travelling from the eight priority provinces and others based in Metro Manila, it's crucial to reflect all management and facilitation aspects needed for this activity in the Technical Proposal. Any additional staffing needs essential for the IP to meet the expected outputs, such as translation/interpretation support or additional research assistance, must be detailed in the technical proposal. Please note that as for the financial equivalents, UNFPA will engage with detailed discussion of the work plan and the financial requirements with the selected IP upon onboarding. The UNFPA Programme and Operations team will work hand in hand to monitor Monitoring, Coordination and progress of all deliverables and the entire partnership. quality check arrangements: The IC will additionally oversee the work of the IP in accordance with the anticipated study deliverables. Expected travel: The assignment will commence with virtual sessions aimed at finalizing the IP agreement, work plans, inception report, and literature review. Subsequently, fieldwork for data collection will promptly begin. The scheduling of these missions will be contingent upon the availability of both parties, primarily aligning with the study phases outlined in the inception report, which will be developed by the IC with support from the IP. The duration of the field data collection will be determined by both the IC and the IP, provided it falls within the first 4 months of the study timeframe.
